



CJI Advocates for National Judicial Policy to Reduce Divergence

On Constitution Day, Chief Justice of India Surya Kant called for a uniform national judicial policy to promote predictability and coherence in judicial decisions across the Supreme Court and 25 High Courts.

Key Points:

- **Access to Justice:** Barriers such as **cost, language, distance, and delay** prevent marginalized sections from obtaining justice, creating inequalities.
- **Judicial Infrastructure:** Strengthening courts and judicial processes is necessary for **effective justice delivery**.
- **Alternative Dispute Resolution:** Emphasised **mediation** as a **cost-effective, participatory, and humane method** for resolving disputes.
