

Constitution Day of India 2024

- 2015: The Government of India officially declared November 26 as Constitution Day under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, coinciding with the 125th birth anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, the chief architect of the Constitution. Prior to this, November 26 was observed as Law Day.
