Why in the News?

- The **Kalyan civil court** recently ruled that **Durgadi Fort** is owned by the **Maharashtra government**, dismissing the claims made by the **Majlis-E-Mushawarat Trust**.
- The Trust had filed a claim in **1976**, arguing that the fort houses both a **mosque** and an **idgah** (prayer hall), alongside a **temple dedicated to Goddess Durga**.

Key Facts About Durgadi Fort

1. Historical Significance:

- Durgadi Fort dates back to the 16th century, originally part of the Adil Shahi Sultanate based in Bijapur.
- It is mentioned in British documents as early as 1570, housing a tomb, prayer space, and other structures.
- In 1760, after the Marathas captured Kalyan, they built a wooden temple dedicated to **Durgadevi** and renamed the fort **Durgadi Killa** (Fort of Durga).
- After the **British** took control of Kalyan in **1818**, the temple ceased functioning, and by **1876**, the **idol of Goddess Durga** was stolen.

2. Geographical Location:

- Durgadi Fort is located in **Kalyan** in **Thane district**, about **50 km** northeast of **Mumbai**.
- The fort is situated on elevated ground, offering scenic views over the **Ulhas River**.

3. Cultural and Religious Impact:

- The fort holds **significant religious importance** for both Hindus and Muslims.
- Initially, the fort housed a **mosque**, but it was later modified by the Marathas to include a **Durga temple**.
- Durgadi Fort has been a site of **communal tensions**, reflecting the complex intersection of **religious identity** and **historical heritage** in Maharashtra.
