- **Distribution:** Found mainly in the **Terai lowlands of India and Nepal**.
- **Threats:**
- **Habitat loss** due to agricultural expansion and grassland reclamation.
- **Nest predation** affecting breeding success.
- **Wetland degradation** and human disturbances.
