

## India set to assume presidency of IIAS, a global federation

## Context

• India has won the Presidency of the International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS) for the 2025-2028 term, a government statement said on Wednesday.

## **International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS)**

• The IIAS is a global federation comprising 31 member countries, 20 national sections, and 15 academic research centres, collaborating on scientific research in public administration. While the IIAS is **not a formally affiliated body of the United Nations**, it actively engages with the UN's work in the field of public administration

• India has been a member since 1998, represented by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances.

• For the upcoming term, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had nominated V. Srinivas, Secretary of the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, as India's candidate in November 2024.

• Four nations — India, South Africa, Austria, and Bahrain — submitted nominations. The **election**, held on June 3, 2025, saw India and Austria advance to the final round.

• India's candidacy received widespread support from across the membership, the statement said.

• This is **first time in the 100 years history of IIAS that the election** to the post of President was held by **ballot process (and not by consensus)** and it is the **first time that India has secured** the historic mandate for the Presidency of the IIAS.
