- **The News:** Discovered in the Boramani grasslands of Solapur (Maharashtra), measuring 50x50 feet with 15 concentric circles.
- **Basics:** A labyrinth is a complex stone path used for rituals, navigation, or symbolic purposes. This is the **largest circular labyrinth** found in India.
- **Archaeological & Trade Context:**
- **Satavahana Connection:** Estimated to be **2,000 years old**, dating back to the Satavahana period—a golden era of Indo-Roman trade.
- **Indo-Roman Link:** The design resembles classical Roman labyrinths found on Mediterranean coins, suggesting it might have served as a **navigational marker or ritual site** for merchants traveling from the coast to the hinterland.
- **Cultural Symbolism:** It mirrors the Indian concept of **Chakravyuh**, showcasing a blend of indigenous philosophy and global trade influences.
