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Manipur's Development Push Strengthens Connectivity, Inclusive Growth and Peacebuilding in India's North-East

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Recent Developments:

- On **13 September 2025**, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated development projects worth over **₹1,200 crore in Imphal** and laid the foundation stone for projects worth over **₹7,300 crore in Churachandpur**, marking a major development push across Manipur.
- The Imphal projects include the **Civil Secretariat, IT SEZ building, New Police Headquarters, Manipur Bhawans in Delhi and Kolkata, and four Ima Markets**, while the Churachandpur package covers urban roads, drainage, asset management, National Highways, the Manipur Infotech Development Project and working women's hostels.
- The visit was significant because it represented the Prime Minister's **first visit to Manipur since the outbreak of ethnic violence in May 2023**, giving the development agenda an important peacebuilding dimension.
- The Prime Minister emphasised **dialogue, peace and a strong bridge of harmony between the hills and valley**, linking development with restoration of trust and social stability.
- The broader North-East development push also included the inauguration of the **51.38-km Bairabi-Sairang railway line**, which connected Mizoram's capital region with the national railway network for the first time.

Development Architecture of Manipur:

Infrastructure and Urban Connectivity:

- The **Manipur Urban Roads, Drainage and Asset Management Improvement Project**, valued at over **₹3,600 crore**, seeks to improve urban mobility and strengthen Imphal's infrastructure.
- Five **National Highway projects worth more than ₹2,500 crore** are intended to improve inter-district connectivity and strengthen access to markets, services and neighbouring regions.
- Better road connectivity can reduce the geographical isolation of hill and tribal areas while supporting the movement of agricultural, horticultural and handicraft products.
- The **Civil Secretariat and Police Headquarters at Mantripukhri** strengthen administrative and security infrastructure and can improve institutional capacity.

Digital Economy and Employment:

- The **Manipur Infotech Development Project**, involving more than **₹500 crore**, seeks to strengthen the state's digital and technology ecosystem.
- The **IT Special Economic Zone** can support technology enterprises, startups, investment and skilled employment, thereby diversifying Manipur's predominantly traditional economic base.
- Digital infrastructure can also improve access to **e-governance, education, financial services and employment opportunities**, particularly for younger populations.

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Women-led Economic Development:

- The inauguration of **four Ima Markets** reinforces Manipur's distinctive tradition of women-led commerce.
- **Ima Keithel**, traditionally associated with thousands of women traders, represents an important example of women's economic participation and community-based markets.
- Expanding women-centric infrastructure can promote **entrepreneurship, livelihood security and financial inclusion**, while strengthening the local economy.
- The proposed **working women's hostels at nine locations** further connect infrastructure development with women's workforce participation.

Peace, Security and Inclusive Development:

Hills–Valley Dimension:

- Manipur's development challenge is closely connected with the **ethnic and geographical divide between the valley and hill regions**.
- Infrastructure investment alone cannot ensure sustainable peace; development must be accompanied by **dialogue, reconciliation, rehabilitation, institutional trust and equitable access to public services**.
- Projects covering both Imphal and Churachandpur provide an opportunity to demonstrate a more **balanced development approach** across different geographical and social regions.
- Effective implementation should therefore prioritise **non-discriminatory service delivery, transparent rehabilitation and participatory governance**.

Relief and Rehabilitation:

- The Union Government has provided assistance through a **special package for Manipur**, including support related to security, CAPF deployment, housing and rehabilitation of internally displaced persons.
- The package includes support for **7,000 houses**, assistance for partially damaged houses, compensation for fully burnt houses and creation of community assets in resettled habitations.
- Such measures are important for converting relief into **long-term rehabilitation, livelihood restoration and social reintegration**.

North-East Connectivity and Act East Policy:

Mizoram's Railway Connectivity:

- The **Bairabi–Sairang railway line** extends 51.38 km and brought the Aizawl region onto India's national railway network in September 2025.
- The line strengthens the North-East's physical integration with the rest of India and improves access to **markets, education, healthcare, tourism and logistics**.
- Its strategic importance is enhanced by Mizoram's proximity to **Myanmar and Bangladesh**, making transport connectivity relevant to India's **Act East Policy** and wider subregional integration.
- Within a year of commissioning, railway freight operations have supported the movement of **cement, construction materials, automobiles, sand and stone chips**, demonstrating the line's emerging logistics potential.

Manipur as a Strategic Gateway:

- Manipur occupies a strategically important position because **Moreh** provides an established India–Myanmar border-trade interface.
- Improved roads, digital infrastructure and logistics can strengthen Manipur's role in **cross-border trade, tourism and regional value chains**.

- North-East connectivity can therefore contribute simultaneously to **economic integration, border-area development and national security**.

Social and Economic Significance:

Women, Youth and Human Capital:

- Women-centric markets and working women's hostels can increase **female labour-force participation** and strengthen local entrepreneurship.
- IT infrastructure can create opportunities for **skill development, digital employment and technology-led enterprises**.
- Sports infrastructure can leverage Manipur's established sporting culture and contribute to **youth development, employment and India's sporting soft power**.
- The **National Sports University** provides an institutional platform for sports education, research, training and high-performance development.

Culture and Tourism:

- Manipur possesses distinctive cultural assets associated with **polo, indigenous traditions, handlooms, performing arts and historical sites**.
- Manipur Tourism identifies **Mapal Kangjeibung** as one of the world's oldest living polo grounds and highlights the historical and economic significance of Ima Market.
- Integrating cultural tourism with improved connectivity can generate **local employment, MSME opportunities and livelihood diversification**.

Key Challenges:

Implementation and Governance:

- Large infrastructure projects require **timely completion, transparent procurement, effective maintenance and coordination between Union and State institutions**.
- Development outcomes may remain uneven if improved connectivity is not accompanied by **healthcare, education, skills, credit and market access**.

Peace and Reconciliation:

- Persistent insecurity can disrupt infrastructure construction, investment and normal economic activity.
- Sustainable development requires **restoration of public trust, community dialogue, rehabilitation of displaced persons and constitutional governance**.
- A durable settlement must address both immediate humanitarian concerns and longer-term questions of **identity, representation, land, security and inter-community relations**.

Way Forward:

Integrated Development Strategy:

- Combine **infrastructure expansion with peacebuilding, rehabilitation and inclusive governance** rather than treating development and security as separate objectives.
- Ensure that hill and valley regions receive **equitable access to roads, healthcare, education, digital services and livelihood opportunities**.
- Develop Manipur as a **technology, tourism, sports and cross-border trade hub** within the wider North-East economic corridor.
- Strengthen **women-led enterprises, local value chains and youth skilling** to convert infrastructure investment into durable employment.

- Use connectivity projects under the **Act East Policy** to deepen India's engagement with Myanmar and the wider Southeast Asian region while maintaining border security.
- Adopt measurable outcomes for **rehabilitation, employment, female participation, connectivity and social reconciliation** to ensure that public investment produces inclusive development.
