

Modi likely to attend BRICS summit in Brazil next month, meet closely watched by US govt

Context

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi is expected to travel to **Rio De Janeiro** in July to attend the BRICS summit in Brazil, sources said here.

• The gathering is being closely watched by the Donald Trump administration in the U.S. that sees **BRICS as a counterweight to the G-7** group of developed nations.

• In addition, BRICS discussions on the use of **alternative or national currencies for trade** are likely to trigger reactions in the U.S., given warnings in the past few months by U.S. President Trump against any "**de-dollarisation**" **plans by BRICS**

BRICS

• The BRICS now represent **half the world's population** and 39% of global GDP. The **G-7**, on the other hand — comprising **Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the U.K., and the U.S.,** along with the EU — accounts for about 30% of the world's GDP.

• BRICS is an intergovernmental informal grouping of 10 emerging economies of the world.

• BRICS stands for the original founding members, **Brazil, Russia, India, and China, with South Africa** joining in 2010.

• In 2024, Iran, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Saudi Arabia, Egypt, Ethiopia and Indonesia also became its members.

• Argentina was initially expected to join the group in 2024 but later decided against it.

• The first BRIC Summit was held in Russia in 2009.
