Democratic Accountability: The goal of high economic growth (\$\approx \\$30\$ trillion economy) and prosperity relies on **good governance**. The Constitution ensures this through democratic institutions, the **Rule of Law**, and a commitment to transparency.

Example: Government efforts to simplify processes and achieve "**maximum governance, minimum government**" (e.g., decriminalization of minor offenses under various corporate laws) directly support the constitutional requirement for an efficient, user-friendly, and accountable government, enhancing the **Ease of Doing Business**.
