

The State of Food and Agriculture Report 2025:

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The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) has released the State of Food and Agriculture (SOFA) 2025 report titled "Addressing Land Degradation Across Landholding Scales".

Key Findings of the Report:

About 20?% of global cropland is showing declining productivity due to human?induced land degradation (soil erosion, loss of organic carbon, nutrient depletion).

There are large yield gaps (up to around 70?%) in regions like South? Asia and Sub? Saharan Africa, linked to degraded soils and weak resource access.

The report emphasises a hierarchy of action: Avoid ? Reduce ? Reverse land degradation, and stresses the need for tailored policies (regulatory and incentive?based) across different land?holding scales to restore sustainable agrifood systems
